The Continent of Africa

Winter 2019

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In this edition of the BES news, we focus on the promotion of Bibletime resources throughout the African continent. We have included up to date prayer requests, personal testimonies and accounts of what God is doing in many countries. We can praise God for the devoted and hard-working Christians within Africa who have a vision to reach the children with Bibletime Booklets and Lessons. Since we last reported on Africa in 2017, the spread of BES work has greatly increased, and several new countries have shown an interest. It was a great joy to have representatives from 15 different African countries back in April, at the BES International Conference. We continue to thank God for the tremendous help given by Revival Movement, and we estimate that 90% of the Bibletime Booklets they produce go to Africa.

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Angola

Issac Buca

In 2017, Pastor Isaac Buca, the IEIA secretary, attended the Pan African Brethren Conference in Addis Abba, where Stephen Gillham introduced him to BES. In 2018, he tried to obtain some Portuguese Bibletime from Brazil, but this was not successful. However, in June this year, Revival Movement printed Portuguese Bibletime Booklets specifically for Angola, and part of the first shipment is due to arrive by the end of this month, courtesy of MMN (Medical Missionary News). The Brethren Churches in Angola are all very excited and plan to organise some training once the Booklets have arrived. He requests prayer that the children and youth will embrace the Word of God through the teaching.



Burkina Faso



Christine with Sawadogo Pabakba are the BES Coordinators in Burkina Faso. BES was first introduced into Burkina Faso by Stephen Gillham in 2017, when 80,000 Bibletime Booklets were shipped there by Revival Movement. Since then, the quantities have increased and earlier this year 140,000 Booklets were sent, which is still proving insufficient – the demand is so great!

A committee of 18 people was established to oversee the distribution of the Bibletime material to the 125 Assemblies of God churches within the region of the capital, all of whom, have in various ways, used or are still using the material. The aim of the BES committee is to introduce the Booklets to the 8,000 villages in Burkina Faso. The material has been distributed to areas of Kadiogo, Signonghin, Saaba, Bogodogo, and North and South Boulmiougou. The Bibletime Booklets are not only for the benefit of the Assemblies of God churches, but other denominations, such as the Christian Alliance, The Mission Apostolic and the SIM Church. Some schools and Good News Clubs have also benefited from the resources. They are very much aware of their need of accountability, training and careful usage of the material. The committee don't let anybody have the BES material unless they have been to the training and a member of the committee visits each church on Sundays to see how the Booklets are being used. Etienne Simpure, who is the main trainer, has recently been very ill in hospital. He has now fully recovered, and is training teachers once again, praise God!

Tarnagda Cintia, who is a teacher, has found that since the introduction of the Bibletime Booklets into the class, the children's attendance has improved. She says, *"Since we started using the BES resources, the children come here more regularly because they learn from the pictures, understand things more quickly, and the Booklets are interesting and easy to use"*.

Ashbell and Thirsta, both 12 years old and from the Apostolic Church, think the Bibletime Booklets have helped to change their lives. Thirsta says, *"It has shown me how I should be following Jesus, and I have started to obey my parents and teachers"*, and Ashbell says, *"I have learnt verses from the Bibletime Booklet and I now read my Bible regularly which has helped me to treat others more kindly. Thank you for this Booklet"*.





Cameroon

Noel Tanekeu (ZAM)

Noel is the coordinator of the BES ministry in Cameroon. The BES material is mainly distributed in Cameroon through the Baptist and Evangelical churches. Noel tells us that the Bibletime Booklets have been well received because of their structured logical layout and the interesting activities, games and puzzles which the children find challenging and enjoyable. Mercy, a brother from the Evangelical Assembly says, *“I have bilingual Sunday School classes, with both French and English-speaking children in the same room. So, the fact that the Bibletime Booklets are available in both French and English makes it a really enjoyable and beneficial time for me”*.



CAR (Central African Republic)

N'djama Abed-Nego (ZAM)

Abed-Nego was first introduced to BES at an Emmaus Conference in 2016 in Nairobi. When he returned home, he presented the work to the evangelical churches and schools in Bangui (the capital of CAR), where there was much excitement over the prospect of receiving the material. It was not until three years later, in March 2019, that some boxes of Bibletime Booklets arrived from Cameroon. Multiple training sessions were arranged during April in Bangui, Baoli and M'Baiki, much to the delight of the Sunday School teachers. So far, the BES material has been distributed to 20 churches and 3 Christian schools, but there are not enough Bibletime Booklets! Abed-Nego says, *“Our country is eagerly awaiting further Bibletime Booklets with open arms! Thanks to all who have made this work possible”*.

Democratic Republic of Congo

Emmanuel Ngoy Kakudji wa Kita (ZAM)

Over the past three years, Emmanuel and his team, working in the Southeast region of the Democratic Republic of Congo, have distributed 72,180 Bibletime Booklets to 238 churches and 21 primary and secondary schools. The Booklets have been widely received, but there is one testimony which Emmanuel states has particularly impacted them as a team. He says, *“We received a call from a Principal of a Muslim school in Lubumbashi, requesting Bibletime Booklets for some Christian children who attended the school, but whose parents did not want them to learn from the Koran. We sent the Bibletime Booklets as requested. A few months later, we received another call from the same Principal. He said that his daughter had secretly brought a Bibletime Booklet home, and eventually confessed that she didn’t want to be a Muslim anymore, and through reading the stories in the Bibletime Booklet, had accepted Jesus into her life. After some discussions and reading the stories himself, he has decided that the whole school will receive the Bibletime Booklets and learn about Jesus”.*

Jacques Kitulu (ZAM)

Jacques and his small team work in Kinshasa and the neighbouring province of Congo Central (city of Boma). They have distributed a total of 41,564 Bibletime Booklets to over 18 churches and 81 primary schools. They collect reports from Sunday Schools and visit the primary schools who use Bibletime every month to ensure the material is being used properly. Training and refresher sessions are regularly organised for teachers. One teacher, Gédeon, aged 54, writes, *“I am a teacher in a Protestant school, but never had any interest in a relationship with God. I was given a copy of a Bibletime Booklet but took it just to please the BES team. A boy from my class took the Booklet from my desk and began to read it. He then told me about what he had learned, and I became interested. After months of reading and wrestling with God, I finally realised that I needed to put my life in order with my Creator, and now am in the joy of serving the Lord!”* Jacques requests that we give thanks to the Lord for increasing the number of students in schools, whilst also praying that God will help the team to make the most of these opportunities.



Egypt

Ayman

In 2016, Sam Balmer met Ayman at an African conference. Following their discussions, Ayman arranged for the translation of A Series into Arabic. In January 2019, Sam and Paul Somerville visited Egypt for the launch of Bibletime in Arabic. The training took place in Giza where 50 representatives attended from 12 different countries including Algeria, Egypt, Iraq, Jordan, Morocco, Sudan and Turkey. Over 8,000 Bibletime Booklets and 500 International Teaching Guidelines have since been printed within the country and distributed to children and teachers. Please pray for the translation of the B and C Bibletime Series into Arabic, and for wisdom on how to best train teachers in 15 different cities. Please also pray for further finances to support printing of the Bibletime Booklets within Egypt.



Ethiopia

Mulugeta Ashagre

Praise God that the shipment of Amharic Bibletime Booklets is virtually used up! Over 10,000 children have been reached and given a Bibletime Booklet this year. The Amharic B Series is under-going translation but will need some serious work if they are to finish translation, editing, proof-reading, printing and shipping them next year for the children. Please pray over this challenging process. The Oromo Booklets have recently arrived, and the team are eager to start training and distributing them in the East and Western provinces of Ethiopia where most of the Oromo people live. Mulugeta also hopes to begin expansion of the BES ministry into the South East and South West, which are mainly populated by Muslims, and plans to cover the whole country with the BES resources in the next two years. Tadesse also continues to distribute the Bibletime resources through the Compassion Project. Please pray for these challenging and ambitious projects as they spread the Gospel and use Bibletime to reach many children and their families.



Gabon

Gilbert Essone Obang (ZAM)

The spread and distribution of Bibletime in Gabon has been limited due to the small quantity of material received. However, to date, 89 churches and 12 schools in Libreville and surrounding provinces have received and are using the Booklets. The teachers have shown great enthusiasm for the material and have readily attended the training sessions to learn how to best deliver a lesson to the children. They are praying for more French Bibletime Booklets to be delivered soon, and teachers who would mark the children's work.

Ghana

Afia Darkwar

The BES resources have been in Ghana for 5 years now, and there has been an increasing expansion in the use of the material among children in schools, churches and community ministries. The Bibletime resources are now available in 4 out of the 10 regions and are being used in 36 schools, 23 churches, and some Good News Clubs. Afia says, *“The adventurous deeds of God continue to ring in the hearts of many Ghanaian children as they encounter God’s Word in a refreshing and colourful way through the Bible Education Services programme.”* Hilda is a missionary working at the Next Generation Good News Club (GNC) in Navrongo. She was first introduced to Bibletime while visiting Accra, the capital, in June this year and thought the resource was amazing. She says, *“BES has taken away our struggle of trying to put Bible stories together to suit children of all age groups. The children are very happy because they now have materials to work with, and it is really challenging them to study hard knowing that their learning will yield great rewards in the foreseeable future.”* Now, Next Generation GNC is expanding its ministry network to three adjoining communities into Mirigu, Kandiga and Gia.



Ivory Coast

Antoine Sinza & Monhon Tinde Armand (ZAM)

Reverend Antoine Sinza is a Minister at Eglise Parole Vivante (Word Alive Church) in Abidjan. He is also the founder of the youth movement, Impact Jeunesse, and promotes the BES material through these ministries.

Sinza was first introduced to Bibletime in 2011. However, he encountered many problems within his own country to print the BES material locally and tried unsuccessfully to ship the Portuguese material from other sources. Finally, in January 2019, Revival Movement sent the first shipment of 44 boxes, containing 12,000 French Bibletime Booklets to Ivory Coast. After waiting over eight years for the material, the churches and young people were so excited to see it!

Sinza says, “So far, the French Bibletime Booklets have been distributed in two main cities, Aboisso and Abidjan, which is the largest city and the main port for our country. We have reached 60 churches and one youth movement. I have held several training sessions for Sunday School teachers since January, and most of the Bibletime Booklets have now been distributed to children and young people. Our supplies are low, and we are looking forward to receiving more French material soon!”

Monhon Tinde is the co-ordinator of the Emmaus and BES courses with ZAM. He has reported that seven churches and two primary schools are using Bibletime, totalling 350 children in five towns and villages (Bouake, Daloa, Abidjan, Duekoue and Toulepleu).

Both Sinza and Tinde request that we pray that more Bibletime Booklets will be printed and shipped very soon, and that financial support would be available to help with distribution of BES materials.

Kenya

Lazarus Kisau

Since the beginning of the year Lazarus and his team have distributed nearly 200,000 Bibletime Booklets to different churches, groups and organisations in Kenya.

Lazarus Kisau, Regional Director of Emmaus Bible School, writes, *“We are grateful to report that BES Bibletime Booklets have been so great for our children in Kenya. We thank God and Revival Movement that a new shipment of Bibletime Booklets has just arrived. We thank God because the Bibletime material compliments the Emmaus courses; this is because as the parents study Emmaus courses, their children get the opportunity to learn the Scriptures through the BES lessons. We thank God for this provision, and we appreciate very much, the great work Bible Educational Services’ Trustees, Revival Movement and supporters continue to do in making sure these invaluable resources are made available freely to our children here in Kenya. Thank you for helping us impact the next generation for the kingdom of God.”*

Griffins M Musyoka, 12 years, enthusiastically states, *“These courses have just been a blessing to me. I did not know that these Bibletime worksheets carried many meanings from God. It has changed my life; I did not know sin separates man from God. I am looking forward to the arrival of the next lot of Bibletime Booklets from BES. You may not know how excited and astonished I am feeling after going through these Bibletime stories, puzzles, crosswords and games! Bibletime is more than a treasure to me. Thank you very much”.*

Johnstone Amboga, a Sunday School Teacher, says, *“Bibletime is such a fantastic tool in capturing the children’s attention in class. The International Teaching Guidelines assist the teachers with the planning of the lesson and help us to teach the children the right message for their age. The pictures, crosswords and puzzles help the children to recall the events in the Bible stories and also maintain their concentration levels. The memory verse helps the students to remember key pieces of Scripture. Bibletime aids the teachers to equip the children with the proper knowledge of the Word of God.”*



Mali


The BES ministry was launched 12 months ago in Mali, and now 850 local evangelical churches are using the Bibletime Booklets in their Sunday Schools. According to some of the teachers, the Bibletime lessons are a great help for the spiritual growth of both the teachers and the children. Unfortunately demand has outstripped supply, and therefore greater quantities are required in order to maintain continuity and enthusiasm for their usage.

Mozambique

Patrick and Grace Mulenga

Mozambique is continuing to face serious difficulties as a result of cyclones, lack of rain, and the desperate economic situation. These have caused a lot of misery and pain but given Patrick and the team a lot of opportunities to present the Gospel to desperate people and communities. Patrick says, ***“We are facing critical fuel and food shortages, which has hindered our travel, and caused us some challenges in distributing the Bibletime Booklets, which were recently shipped from Revival Movement. Praise God for this latest delivery of 40,000 B Series Bibletime Booklets in Portuguese. In our own local Assembly, we have over 200 children and 20 teachers who attend Sunday School every week, and they were so excited to see the new material arrive!”***

Patrick reports that they have conducted 5 seminars, the largest one being in the north during June where 70 brethren assemblies were represented. So far, they have reached 300 churches throughout Mozambique with the Bibletime Booklets. Delson Amado, a Sunday School teacher, says, ***“The Bibletime Booklets have helped many students to cultivate a taste for reading God’s Word. The material helps us cover the main topics in the Bible throughout each year and we have witnessed so many changed lives, in both students and teachers”.***



Nigeria

Kevin Crawley (Ireland Outreach)

Bibletime Booklets came to Nigeria in 2014 when Sam Balmer met with representatives of Emmaus Bible Centre Mission during one of the annual leadership conferences. They were trained and shown how to deliver a Bibletime lesson, and how to grade and record marks from the Booklets. Each person took several copies of the Level 2 Bibletime Booklet to their own home area allowing the spread of Bibletime from Plateau State to so many parts of the nation. Due to the hunger for good Christian materials, demand for the other Levels grew. Levels 1, 3 and 4 came to Nigeria last year. More and more children, ministers, Sunday School teachers, principals and families are getting to know about the BES materials.

The spread of the Bibletime Booklets into the different ministry areas has been systematic and methodical. First, it was introduced into the Emmaus workers’ family homes which spread to the neighbour’s children. Then it was used in the Street Bible Clubs with children who were traditionally Muslim and had no religious belief. Peter says, ***“The books have made a great contribution to improving my behaviour and moral values, thank you!”*** At the same time, Bibletime was introduced to Sunday Schools, and as the news spread of this great resource, the demand from churches grew. The next stage saw Bibletime being introduced to some schools, like Hope Academy in Jos, Plateau State, where it is used as a devotional every morning with the whole school. James writes, ***“My life is blessed today because of the BES materials.”*** There are reports that many parents do not want to remove their children from the school because of the teaching of the Word of God using Bibletime. Finally, FCS (Fellowship of Christian Students) identified a need to help children and teenagers, who are left to roam the streets during long vacation periods. FCS took the opportunity to organise class sessions for them where they use the BES materials to teach the Bible. Since FCS is a national organisation, they need large quantities for these holiday classes. This successful programme of reaching young people with Bibletime was recently extended to the Internally Displaced Persons (IDP) camp. There are currently 1.5 million children in IDP camps, so the need is great! Please pray for further Bibletime resources to reach all these children.



Rwanda

Aminadab Mbanzabugabo Muteteri

Aminadab is the executive director of Teens for Christ in Rwanda. This year, he and his team have distributed over 200,000 Bibletime Booklets to children in Rwanda, and over 500 teachers have been trained! We praise God for this! Aminadab says, ***“We believe that preparing and equipping children and teenagers through the BES lessons is the best way to build the strong future of our nation and the world. We place great importance and emphasis on training the teachers. We believe that if we train the teachers well on how to deliver the lessons, then the children will understand the Gospel message and teachings of God, and this will shape their lives as they grow up. We hold weekly meetings with them to show the best and proven way to present Bibletime to the children, and also to live their own life as prescribed in the Word of God through BES lessons.”***

In order to keep in touch with all the volunteers and teachers using Bibletime Booklets, Aminadab and his team hold video conferences every Tuesday with those who have smart phones and internet connections. They share ministry updates and discuss the way forward for the week in all regions. They have also changed how they run and conduct Bibletime sessions in the Kigali region, moving their volunteers around to different schools and teaching different chapters from the Bible each week. This method has increased excitement in their meetings as teenagers meet a new teacher often with a new message or different approach, which has encouraged and strengthened them. It also keeps alive their curiosity and hunger for the Word of God.

Aminadab says that they face many challenges. Some of these include reaching the children and distributing the lessons by foot during the rainy season. Transport and communication are still a big test because most of the volunteers in rural areas do not have electronic devices, and therefore they cannot easily send updates or photos to the team. During the summer, Aminadab had intended to present the entire English Bibletime Series to the Ministry of Education, but this was delayed, which has postponed the potential use of Bibletime within schools throughout the entire country. Pray that these challenges will be overcome and new meetings arranged next June. Please also pray for funds (\$12,000) to allow them to purchase a pick-up truck to transport the Bibletime Booklets to remote areas.



South Africa

Marlon and Judy Govender

The Bibletime work in South Africa continues to grow and be blessed. Marlon and Judy Govender and their team distributed over 7,000 Bibletime courses to churches and Sunday Schools in various parts of South Africa in 2018 and have already distributed 3,060 courses in the first 6 months of this year. The majority of the work is centred in the Province of Kwa-Zulu Natal. Marlon says, ***“We are very grateful to the Lord that we have done an extensive tour of South Africa this year and have promoted Bibletime courses in every province of South Africa. We have now signed up 3 new Promoters in Western Province and 2 more in Gauteng. Brother Amir, who lives in South Africa, is working with BES on translating the Bibletime Booklets into Farsi for people from countries like Iran. He has distributed 200 Bibletime courses in Cape Town and has requested a further 2,400 for distribution.”***

Brother Powell Dryer in Stellenbosch, Western Province sent a picture (attached) and this little story. He has been going around his neighbourhood promoting Bibletime and a few weeks later was doing follow up when he discovered that young Janela Keeble, 5 years old, who had just started to read herself was using her Bibletime course to teach her illiterate 92 year old grandmother the Bible stories!

Tanzania

Liz and her husband David are our main BES coordinators in Moshi. They are working hard to translate Bibletime into Swahili alongside their employment, further educational studies and raising a family. This project has been going on for many years, but praise God that over the summer they made great progress in finalising the first few levels of the Bibletime Series. Please pray for them all, and that this first Series of Bibletime in Swahili may be completed and printed in 2020.





Zambia

Willie Bunda

Bibletime lessons were first used in Zambia in September 2010, but BES Zambia was not officially launched until 2011 by Sam Balmer. As it was one of the first international partnership centres to be established in Chingola, it is managed by a board comprising of seven people: Kelvin and Joyce Samwata, Willie and Astridah Bunda, Geshom and Maude Chioni, and Wallace Samiselo. Willie is the full-time National Coordinator who is responsible for training the Sunday School teachers and distributing the Bibletime material to churches and schools.

Willie says, *“We started with Bibletime in a few churches in Chingola, in the Copperbelt Province, and now have grown to nearly 250 churches in Solwezi, Kasama and Mansa, with an average of 80 children per church. We estimate we now reach 20,000 children with Bibletime. Currently we are working in four Provinces, but we have requests for BES material from six other Provinces, and hope to start training in Lusaka, the capital, next year. We mostly work with churches and schools and train teachers to use, teach and mark the Bibletime lessons during a one-day seminar. We praise God for the good connections and partnerships we have made in Solwezi and Mansa.”*

Stories of children desiring to learn are unfolding all the time. They now have a programme for actively encouraging children who attend church to recruit their friends from school to do the Bibletime course. Accompanied by their church friends, these school friends attend the BES office once a month, collect their Bibletime Booklet, take it home, complete it, and then bring it back for marking. They are then given a new Booklet. Willie has found there is real eagerness to learn about God with one girl bringing eight friends to the office from her class at school.

BES Zambia has been asked to assist at the Nchanga Trust School with teaching a Scripture Union club. Willie is assisting in this club using Level 2 Bibletime Lessons. Please pray for this new opening.

They are currently translating Level 1 Bibletime into Bemba which is widely spoken in Zambia. Please pray for Willie and the team as they continue with the translation and proof-reading.

Please also pray for solutions to overcome the challenge of transport to reach churches in outlying provinces and to find good people to partner with as they train and distribute the Bibletime lessons to churches and schools in Zambia.

Zimbabwe

Chunga Jingini and Walter Madimutsa

Chunga, who operates an Emmaus Centre in Zimbabwe has just started to use the Bibletime Booklets in schools in Harare, the capital. The resources have been so well received, and the demand is so great, that four children share a single copy of a Bibletime Booklet in one class. He has also visited three schools in Epworth and trained teachers on how to best teach a Bibletime lesson. They found the International Teaching Guidelines very helpful. Walter and his wife are SIM missionaries and also promote the BES material and programme. Recently, he has had success in distributing a lot of Bibletime Booklets in churches in Bulawayo which is in the southern part of Zimbabwe. They also report that the BES material has been used in many primary schools, some prisons, and with children in social welfare centres and homes. Chunga and Walter are in the process of discussing how best to translate the English Bibletime Booklets into Shona, the local language, but so far little progress has been made. They face many difficulties, mainly relating to severe fuel shortages and power, which makes communication and travel very difficult. They ask for prayer in relation to training, travel, fuel shortages, finance and water shortages.

UPDATE – Revival Movement is in the process of printing large quantities of French Bibletime Booklets for Congo, Ivory Coast, Cameroon, CAR, Gabon, Mali and Burkina Faso. They should be ready to ship at the end of 2019.
