READ: Luke 10: 25-37




Jesus often told stories when He was teaching people. The Bible calls them parables.

The parables that Jesus told were simple stories which contained lessons about God and His ways.

We usually ask a question because we want to know the answer, but sometimes we think we already know the answer. That's the way it was, one day, with a Jewish teacher who was talking to Jesus.


First of all they talked about what God wants us to do. "Love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul, strength and mind," the teacher said.

Jesus then told a story to show him who his neighbour really was. A man went on a journey from Jerusalem to Jericho. On the way he was attacked and robbed and left for dead.




When Jesus had finished telling the story He asked, "Which of these three do you think was a good neighbour?"

When Jesus lived on earth, the Pharisees and Jewish teachers of the law thought that they were better than tax collectors and sinners.



They knew that the shepherd would leave the ninety nine sheep in the open country and go to look for the lost one, until he found it.


When he found it, he would put it on his shoulders and take it home, feeling very happy.



STORY 4: The Sower

How we listen to God's Word





Jesus was sitting in a boat on the lake speaking to the people on the shore. He told them another parable.

He told the people that when a farmer scatters seed on the ground, the seed falls on four different types of ground.


Later on, Jesus told His disciples what the parable meant.

The seed is the Word of God. This includes the words that Jesus spoke and all the other words we read in the Bible.

Q: The different types of soil are like different types of people.

1) Some seed falls on the path and the birds swoop down and eat it.

This means some people hear the Word of God, but Satan comes like a bird and snatches it away (Satan is another name for the devil).




Draw the sun.

2) Some seed falls on rocky ground and begins to grow. Because there isn't much soil, the plants can't make roots. They soon die because the sun scorches them as they have no water.

This means some people say they will follow Jesus, but when trouble comes, they give up. It is plain that they are not Christians. 3) Some seed falls among thorns. The thorns choke the plants and so they die.

This means some people think more of the things they own than they do of Jesus.





4) Some seed falls upon good soil and produces a good harvest.

This means some people receive the Word of God and they become strong Christians, whose lives please God.
