"And how can they hear without..." All of us are aware of the vast spiritual needs of children and young people throughout the world today, so it is encouraging to read of the effective outreach in the Stoke-on-Trent area, and also of the enthusiastic recruitment in the North East Northern Ireland PBS. In Canada the 10th birthday of PBS has been celebrated and numbers continue to grow. There is a developing work in India, both in English and Malayalam, and an increasing interest in Romania and several countries in Africa. It is clear that, potentially, thousands



more children could be receiving Postal Bible School lessons in their native languages. BES Trustees have had to make the policy that, generally speaking, we are unable to fund translation, design, printing, and distribution in other countries. However there are situations where we believe that work could be started with some help from the UK, and that later local believers might take on financial responsibility. To help with this we are introducing a SPONSORSHIP SCHEME where individuals could donate a certain amount each month. (if possible-Gift Aided) The Trustees, at their discretion, would use these gifts as Seed Funding in new areas, or to help with costs in countries where the work is being hampered by financial constraints. Full details of the Sponsorship Scheme are on the

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

We had never held an event like this before, so on the morning of July 4th we were a little anxious and uncertain how things would go, as the weather was showery in the morning, but thankfully it didn't rain from young people. A team of fourteen workers were present on each day. Emmaus Courses were also included – to cater for an older age group. An Emmaus representative from the Eastham Headquarters joined us for the witness – using an Emmaus catalogue with the PBS logo and Living Word P.B.S. featured on the cover.

A simple competition was offered to young people passing the stall and approximately 80 children were contacted in this way on each of the days. On completion they went away with a 'goody bag' with a number of

Level 2, and not so many Level 1's. We realized that if nothing was done to enroll younger ones we would soon have no one to move up from Levels 1 & 2.

We decided to visit local primary schools. We didn't ask the school to use the lesson as part of the school studies, but simply asked would they distribute a leaflet to the children in the school. All the schools were happy to do so. So on a strategic approach, a colourful, stiff leaflet was produced with a reply coupon and the schools acted as a 'postbox'. There were also opportunities to speak to the whole school and explain what PBS was all about. Through this simple means quite a number of children enrolled and then in turn encouraged their friends to do the same.

Another idea was to go to the local agricultural shows with a display stand. Some interactive activities such as 'spot the difference' competitions etc, meant that there was an opportunity to speak to the parents/guardians while the children were doing the quizzes etc. This idea also put PBS in the local spotlight and by being known, others became interested.

An opportunity to talk about PBS was given by a local charity radio, and for approximately half an hour there was a question and answer session on how PBS operates. Each area is different in its approach to recruitment BUT if you had to write this article how would you answer the question 'How do you get new pupils?' Now there's something to think about!!

1:30-6:30 pm and then the heavens truly opened up! We believe the Lord wonderfully answered our prayers and it was a great success. About 125 children, parents and teachers gathered in the afternoon. After a fun game of 'crocker' outside, an hour's children's meeting was held in the Gospel Tent, followed by a barbecue supper. Several parents expressed their appreciation and hoped that it would be repeated! Over 200 family invitations had gone out across our home province of Manitoba, including to all the Hutterite children who are enrolled. The highlight was to see 15 Hutterites attend from a colony where items – including the ALL IMPORTANT APPLICATION FORM.

Opportunity was taken to chat with the parents as the children were completing the competition. Other passers-by were offered a Gospel Tract and also the monthly daily reading publication of the United Christian Broadcasters. There were some who declined - but many others were happy to receive the literature. We were encouraged by the prompt return of a number of PBS application forms soon after the weekend.

Africa 2009 Sam Balmer

It was a rewarding and challenging experience to travel to three countries in the continent of Africa during the month of August.

ZAMBIA was first on my itinerary and there I had the privilege of attending the PABCM (Pan African Brethren Conference on Mission) in Kabwe. Along with meeting some wonderful believers, I had the responsibility of carrying out two workshops on childrens work, one in Portuguese and another in English. Many of the pastors, elders and full time workers from various African countries would love to use the Bibletime lessons but printing is the main problem. Prayer is valued for a solution to this need.

During the conference I visited the Emmaus stand set up by Marlon Govender (Emmaus Regional Director for South Africa) On introducing myself he could not believe that I was a representative from BES! Marlon and his wife had heard about BES and had downloaded and read all the information relevant to commencing a Postal Bible School in South Africa. They had been praying for a month about the material, and then we met! I had wonderful fellowship and they are willing to help coordinate the work in South Africa. Pray for them.

Previous to this Chris and Simone Wilkins commenced using the lessons in the Port-Sheptone area and have recently sent to us the following:- *"We have had an addition of 5 Bibletime Level 3 students to the 23 that are currently enjoying the lesson, thus a total of 28 regular, reliable souls we can account for."* Pray! Kelvin Samwata has approached a school who are considering using lessons that we sent in a container recently. We have forwarded copies of the PDF's of Bibletime lessons to the Emmaus trust of Zambia who are intending to print the lessons and use them with the children they have contact with.

KENYA was a two and a half hour flight from Lusaka. I was met by Lazarus and had a wonderful time with his family and local church. I was staying at the Emmaus Centre in Nairobi. They do a fantastic work in a slum area of Nairobi and seek to help the children physically and spiritually. I also met a brother Moses, his wife and family, he and his team of volunteers are in contact with 30,000+ teenagers per month, and need follow up consecutive bible study material. Moses felt the Bibletime lessons would be ideal. PLEASE pray that the Lord will provide so that this would come to fruition.

TANZANIA and Kilimanjaro was next on the itinerary and NO I wasn't for climbing it! I travelled eight hours to Moshi and spent some time there, visiting some of the missionaries, Berea Bible College, local schools and local churches. The need is great and there is an open door in the education system to teach RE in English.

Three of us, my father, David Mmile (my translator) and myself, travelled from Moshi

to Morogoro to the TELM (Tanzania Evangelical Literature Ministry) AGM, an eight - nine hour bus journey. It was wonderful to believers from meet many various backgrounds seeking to reach and teach the people of Tanzania with literature. I had the opportunity to share about BES and the resources we have in English. David was so encouraging as he had done his homework before hand, and was very proficient in answering their questions. As a result of this trip, David and three fellow students are commencing to translate the Bibletime lessons into Swahili. Please PRAY for this team as this is a major task.

Many of you prayed as I had requested for, "GOD APPOINTMENTS" as I travelled and met various believers. YOU PRAYED and GOD ANSWERED, so please praise Him for what is commencing in the vast continent of Africa through the ministry of BES. It was good to be back in Ireland, 38 hours on buses and 28 hours on planes, and I thank the Lord for health and safety in travel.
