Hungary

We had a very blessed Street-party on Sunday with our Assembly. The main program was face-painting for children for free! As one paint lasts for approx. 10 minutes, we had that time to have a discussion with the parents – and of



course can give several leaflets including Bibletime. We painted nearly 100 children's faces and collected 60 e-mail addresses from the parents. Lots of them were interested in Bibletime too! Lessons series A are designed in the new form, series B is ongoing monthly. Translation of series C is ready, the design work will start at the end of this year. The BES website is working fully in Hungarian. Starter lessons and the whole series A can be downloaded from the website. The rest will be uploaded continually. Over 30 children get the lessons regularly through e-mail, some of them in printed form too. I've contacted three organisations who are involved in Prison mission. The leaders of the Prison Fellowship and the Prison Chaplains Association are open to use Level 4 in the prisons. They have personal contact with more than 1,500 prisoners. *- Tamas Bozsoki, August 2010*

Romania

At the moment we print 4300 Bibletime courses per month, out of which 1434 courses are used in the 33 Sunday Schools or children's groups (1034 in Romania and 400 in Moldova) and the rest are being posted to the PBS students. During these two months 651 children applied to do the Bibletime courses, with a total of 2263 children for the year (These are not calculated in the total number of regular students!).

PBS CAMP - This year, as in the last three years, we organised two camps, one for the teenagers and another one for children. The first camp, for children was held in July, in Saliste, near Sibiu and we had 22 children. During the week we studied lessons from Daniel's life. We had a team of four Irish young people plus Sam Balmer who did the Bible teaching and we all enjoyed their efforts, both for the spiritual part of it (Bible teaching, testimonies) as well as for its "funny"part (games, trips etc). The senior camp was held in August, in Balan. (aprox. 260 km from Cluj) We had 23 participants coming from different backgrounds, from 7 counties from Romania. We studied the book of Philippians. We were all challenged to reflect on our own lives and answer some questions, the most important being on Phil. 1:21 "For me to live is ..." what? - *Mihaela Vlas, September 2010*

We are going to print the Emmaus bulletin and I have an article and photos about BES ministry in the Chernobyl area. Here the Revival Baptist church has 560 children as BES students and dozens of Emmaus adult students.

Zambia

We arranged two seminars, held over two days, for approx 150 who attended from a wide area. This was very well organised and encouraging. There is much praise for what BES are doing. They were from a variety of churches (49 represented) and some schools, especially in the Chingola area. They are worried about coping with the demand they are expecting. There are three couples in the committee, Kelvin and Joyce Samwata, Gershom and Maud Chioni, Willie & Astirdah Bunda. Willie is happy to coordinate BES in Zambia and report to BES UK with stock sheets and reports etc. Willie and his wife live by faith and their support is limited.

The BES Bible time lessons are going on well. I am busy explaining about the program to various churches that did not attend the seminar. The number of churches wanting to register is increasing every week. I am forced to put some churches on the waiting list. About 50 churches from Chingola have registered. We shall get to Kitwe next year and we expect 100 churches to register because we have more churches there and later in the year go to Ndola another City and we also expect about 100. We shall sit down with the committee and look at the best way to get into the bigger cities. We shall not rush but learn from Chingola churches and go slowly to other towns. We are preparing for a good start of the program in September 2010.

Tanzania

There were approx 100 who attended the training from a wide area. This was very well organised and encouraging. There was a wide variety of churches represented. We have been offered storage in the Emmaus centre in Uchira-Moshi. This is ideal except we will have to buy a container for storage. David Ombeni is happy to coordinate the lessons and provide stock sheets etc. There is a team translating into Swahili, I had a meeting with them and they are a wonderful group of young people. There were three seminars, approx 60, 55 and 100 attended from a wide area, but especially from Nairobi. One pastor reaches 1200 children and wants to implement the lessons immediately. We have been offered storage at the Emmaus centre in Nairobi, this is ideal except we will have to buy a container or two for the storage. These cost about £1200 each. Moses, Lazarus and Ezron are happy to coordinate the use of the lessons. They are to set up a small committee to oversee the work of BES in Kenya. - Sam Balmer, May 2010



South India

We are happy to inform you that by God's grace, Bibletime ministry is progressing and going on well. God has enabled us to print the Starter Lessons and A1 to A6 of each level in our language Malayalam. The remaining lessons (A7-A12) are translated and ready for printing. More than 2000 students are already reached with these lessons. We are in touch with 500 children's clubs, each club has average 25 to 30 students. The response to the lessons is very encouraging and all of them are being blessed. Many non Christian children are being reached. All the teachers and leaders are very happy to use these lessons. They said, 'we have been praying for such teaching material for a long time and God answered our prayer'. Praise the Lord. We conducted 20 training programs for Sunday school teachers over the last three months. It really helped them to use these lessons more effectively in their clubs and Sunday schools. We praise God for HIS wonderful provision to print these lessons so far. We trust and pray that God will provide all our needs in the future also. We want to thank you for the prayers for the Bibletime ministries in India. Let's work together with our Master for HIS kingdom and glory. God is faithful.

Far East

The staff from the four schools we are working with have met and have approved using BES materials for their Religious Education programs. At present we are not planning to translate the courses but eventually this might happen if the ministry continues to grow.

Other News

Condolences

Sadly William Irwin of Belfast has recently been called home. William was a very faithful distributor of Postal Bible School lessons especially to Nigeria and approx 200 were sent each month. William's students have now been transferred to the Tyrone and Fermanagh Postal Bible School Group. Pray that the contacts with these students will be maintained.

Future Plans

A number of Postal Bible School Centres are sending lessons overseas and the cost is extremely high. There is no guarantee in all situations that the students receive these lessons. One possible way of overcoming

this, is for students to do lessons on-line in areas where there is reasonable access to the Internet. This is not straight forward but we are looking at a Feasibility Study to move this forward. Again we would value prayer that it might be a means of contacting many students where the cost and reliability of the post are a real problem.

Summer Outreach

As the UBM season has come to an end for the year, PBC is getting busier! This is the time of year when we are still receiving new applications for PBC from those who have met beach teams over the summer, and usually continue to do so into October. So far this summer we have had 308 new applications for PBC, and have also had several new markers sign up; this is in addition to approximately 320 children who are currently doing PBC. This is a great way for children to start reading the Bible and learning about the Lord, and can also be a witness to the whole family, as in the following story:

A team member at Mablethorpe this year was standing on the prom on a wet and windy day when she was approached by a family who said they had met UBM there 10 years ago. Their daughter had taken a PBC leaflet then

and signed up, and through this the whole family had become Christians, and were now active in a local church! What an amazing encouragement to those who have been on UBM this summer, that even if they do not see the fruit of their labour, God can continue to work in people's hearts long after the Beach Team have gone home.
